Growing Pains

About 25% of children experience "growing pains", which generally occur in early childhood among 3- to 5-year-olds, and later on to 8- to 12-year-olds.

"The most likely causes of growing pains are the aches and discomforts resulting from jumping, climbing, and running by active children during the day," explained Pediatrician Laurie Penix, M.D. "Although growing pains often strike in late afternoon or early evening before bed, there are occasions when pain can wake a slumbering child. The intensity of the pain varies from child to child, and most children don't experience the pains every day."

"Growing pains usually concentrate in the muscles, rather than the joints," Dr. Penix continued. "Most children report pain in the front of their thighs, in the calves, or behind the knee. Massage, stretching, heat, acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Advil) may help to relieve the pain. While joints affected by more serious diseases are swollen, red, tender, or warm, the joints of children experiencing growing pains appear normal."

When to Call Your Doctor

Your child's doctor should be alerted if any of the following symptoms occur with your child's pain: persistent pain, swelling, or redness in one particular area or joint; fever; limping; unusual rashes; loss of appetite; weakness; tiredness; or other uncharacteristic behavior. Pains or symptoms localized to the shoulders, arms, wrists, hands, fingers, neck, or back, or pain associated with a particular injury are not due to growing pains, and should be evaluated by a physician.

Parents Who Host Lose The Most

Underage Drinking Laws

What parents should know:

- As a parent, you cannot give alcohol to your teen's friends under the age of 21 under any circumstance, even in your own home, even with their parent's permission.
- You cannot knowingly allow a person under 21, other than your own child, to remain in your home or on your property while consuming or possessing alcohol.
- **If you break the law:**

- You can face a maximum sentence of six months in jail and/or a \$1,000 fine.
- Others can sue you if you give alcohol to anyone under 21 and they, in turn, hurt someone, hurt themselves or damage property.
- Officers can take any alcohol, money or property used in committing the offense.

Things you can do as a parent:

- Refuse to supply alcohol to children.
- Be at home when your teen has a party.
- Make sure that alcohol is not brought into your home or property by your teen's friends.
- Talk to other parents about not providing alcohol at other events your child will be attending.
- Create alcohol-free opportunities and activities in your home so teens will feel welcome.
- Report underage drinking by calling the anonymous, toll-free Hotline at 1-877-4-MINORS.
