Message from the Superintendent

In October of 2010, Crestview Local joined with 487 other public and community school districts in Ohio in applying for Race to the Top Grant funds. Race to the Top was a four year grant fund that required schools to commit to a four-year process of transforming our schools. The Ohio Department of Education provided over \$100,000.00 to our schools as an incentive to participate in this innovative program. As a part of the grant process, Crestview Local agreed to develop a collaborative approach to school decision-making, to provide leadership in implementing the new Ohio learning standards, to strive to increase our graduation rate, to reduce achievement gaps for all students and to increase college enrollment for 18-19 year olds.



As we are now in the final year of this challenging initiative, the Crestview Race to the Top transformation team met recently with state officials to review our accomplishments and to make plans for sustaining our success. Some of the achievements that have occurred as a result of Race to the Top include:

District Performance:

- District Performance Index has increased from 96.2 to 99.6
- Graduation rate has increased from 94.3% to 95.9%
- Since 2010, the Crestview Elementary School has twice been named a “*School of Promise*” and once was rated as “*Excellent with Distinction*”
- This year, the Crestview School District was recognized by the P-16 Council as the only school in Columbiana County to receive an “A” in both Standards Met and Overall Value-Added

New Initiatives that have occurred as a result of Race to the Top:

- The District began a Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (S.T.E.M.) program for middle school and high school students. This year the program expanded to include *InventorCloud*, a new cloud based program for high school students that allow the student to not only design but manufacture projects
- High School to Higher Ed alignment program. Crestview was awarded a grant to collaborate with four other schools (East Palestine, Leetonia, Lisbon, and Southern) and three universities (YSU, Kent State and Eastern Gateway) to create a curriculum alignment from high school to college
- Virtual A.P. program. Crestview was awarded a grant to initiate a virtual Advanced Placement program that allowed high school students the opportunity to take A.P. courses online. This grant allowed us to offer A.P. courses to our students free of charge
- To help prepare our students for the 21st Century Skills, Crestview High School initiated a new 1:1 computer program (*Digital Connections*)

Collaboration:

- The Crestview Schools created a Transformation Team made up of Board members, teachers and administrators that has worked together to develop professional development opportunities for staff, to consider changes in policy that reflect a high performing school including the implementation of new teaching standards and the development of a new teacher evaluation system
- The Transformation Team also strives to communicate Race to the Top activities to the community through monthly presentations to the Board and by placing regular articles in the Informagram

It is easy to see that the Race to the Top initiative has had a very positive impact on the growth and success of the Crestview District. The additional funding provided by the Race to the Top grant and the ongoing hard work and commitment of our staff and administration allows us to meet the mission of our schools which states that we will “*educate and empower every student with the knowledge and skills for success in an ever-changing world.*”

CHRISTMAS GIFT EXCHANGE

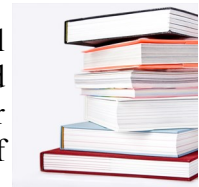

Crestview Elementary has been designated as a School of Promise by the Department of Education based on 2012-13 report card results. The Schools of Promise award program recognizes schools attaining solid student achievement in reading and mathematics while serving a significant number of economically disadvantaged students. Schools of Promise must have a 75 percent or better average proficiency rate on the Ohio Achievement Assessments for the 2012-13 school year. We are extremely proud of our elementary staff and students. The state report card indicates that Grades 3 and 4 students did well on last year's Ohio Achievement Assessments. They met 5 out of 5 indicators in Reading and Math. Congratulations again to our students and their teachers for a job well done!

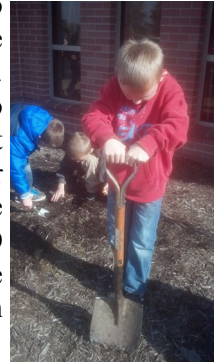
Students Planted Fall Bulbs

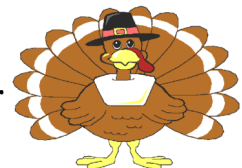
Red Ribbon Week
